Permit Requirements Worksheet

What is the difference between non-practising and former registrant? Non-practising individuals continue to receive communications from the College and need to renew this status annually, while former registrants do not. Neither are entitled to practise or use protected titles.

Non-practising applications are for registered nurses (RNs) and nurse practitioners (NPs) who do not plan to practise in Alberta.

WHAT CAN I DO ON THE NON-PRACTISING REGISTER?



Individuals on the non-practising register will have an inactive status that allows them to continue to receive regulatory updates through email.

Non-practising individuals are not entitled to use protected titles (e.g., registered nurse, nurse practitioner, certified graduate nurse), and cannot provide nursing services.

If you intend on performing any of the activities listed below, you will need to complete a renewal or return to practice application:

- Nursing practice
- Volunteer hours where nursing skills are required
- Committee hours related to nursing
- Nursing consulting services
- Self-employment related to nursing
- Providing nursing education
